




TRIBUTE

JOSÉ OUBRERIE — 1932-2024

The last member of Le Corbusier's studio left us on 10 March. A graduate of the École nationale supérieure des Beaux-Arts in Paris, he joined 35 rue de Sèvres in the last days of 1957 at the age of 25, and signed his first plans in January 1958. Until the studio closed, he worked on numerous projects, including the Maison du Brésil, the Zurichhorn, the Venice Hospital and the vast Firminy-Vert project. After Le Corbusier's death, he worked tirelessly on the construction of the Church of Firminy, which he completed in 2007. He is also responsible for a number of buildings of his own, including the Miller House in Lexington and the cultural centre in Damascus. José Oubrerie was also a teacher, first in Paris, then in the United States - where he lived - at the University of Ohio and the University of Kentucky. He has also been a guest professor at a number of schools and universities (Milan, New York, Columbia, Paris, etc.), and the author of numerous publications and exhibitions (Architecture Interrumpus at the Wexner Center for the Arts, 2007). With Giuliano Gresleri, he was responsible for the replica of the Pavillon de l'Esprit Nouveau in Bologna, inaugurated on 10 October 1977. José Oubrerie was involved in preparing the next Rencontres de la Fondation on the studio at 35 rue de Sèvres, and was always generous in sharing his memories and comments, which helped us to better understand this unique place, as well as shedding light on Le Corbusier's work.

The deadline for applications is 15 June 2024.



ASSOCIATION MAISON BLANCHE - ACQUISITION OF FURNITURE

The Maison Blanche association has just acquired the furniture designed by Le Corbusier in 1914-1915 for the doctor Francis Descoedres. The bookcase and desk are now on display at the Maison Blanche reception desk. A daybed and a cane armchair complete the ensemble. They need to be restored and will be installed in the spring.

Following the call for applications for residencies on the Cap Moderne site, the association received forty projects from architects, artists and researchers with very diverse profiles.

The jury met on 12 March at the Foundation and selected the projects of two young architects who will spend successive periods on the site in the spring and autumn:

Sai Alon holds a master's degree in architecture from the Bezalel Academy of Art and Design in Jerusalem. She was a project manager in Peter Zumthor's studio.

Her project consists of documenting, studying and revealing the architectural works on the Roquebrune-Cap-Martin site by multiplying the original points of view to deepen the perception of the site and its objects. Temporary installations will be used to frame the landscape or create shaded observation posts.

Théophile Chatelais has a degree in project management from the Ecole Nationale d'Architecture Paris-La Villette, a Master 2 from the Ecole du Paysage de Versailles and a degree in philosophy. His writing project is rooted in the 'American Prologue' to *Précisions*, in which Le Corbusier contrasts 'architects' houses' with 'men's houses'. The idea of the simple life as experienced by Le Corbusier and embodied in the unique habitat of Le Cabanon will be confronted with Gilles Deleuze's writings on cinema, particularly the films of Yasujiro Ozu.



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
